

Weekend Backpack Meals

Weekly food bags provide children with nutritional support over the weekend. The program grew from 294 children served in 2022 to 429 in 2023, a 46% increase.

Homebound Senior Meal Boxes

Weekly food boxes provide healthy, easily prepared food for local seniors. Food is delivered by volunteers who also check on the wellbeing of senior clients.

Holiday Meal Boxes

Boxes provide families with the extra food needed to celebrate the holidays in November & December. 2023 saw a 17% increase in meals provided compared to 442 in 2022.

Meals for Unaccompanied Youth - A New Program

Weekly food bags provide meals that can be prepared easily by teens living on their own.

Awarded Vail Game Changer Distinction

In September Greater Vail Community ReSources received the "Vail Game Changer" award from the Greater Vail Chamber of Commerce. This distinction recognizes the growing role that ReSources plays within the community as demonstrated through its expanding programs, strategic collaborations and success in acquiring regional funds to serve the people of Vail and S.E. Pima County.

Weekend Backpack Program Workroom

Funding provided by Ward 4, City of Tucson allowed for the construction of a custom container workroom and installed at the Vail Food bank. The addition of space was critical to keep pace with the growing number of children needing additional food support.

New Grocery Rescue Van

A major effort secured funding to purchase a slightly used, refrigerated van. Initially the van will ensure continuation of the grocery rescue program which ferries a monthly average of 20,000 pounds of food to share with clients. The van will also allow ReSources to secure other food opportunities. As plans develop, the van can also be used as a mobile food bank, serving rural SE Pima County.

Vail Depot Reaches Annual Sales Record

Depot staff and volunteers worked hard this year to sort and display as many items as would fit on the sales floor. The power of social media was harnessed to provide dedicated thrift shoppers with regular updates of the wonderful items available and to publicize sales. Inventory management, creative marketing and so many volunteer hours led to a sales increase of 14% for 2023.
