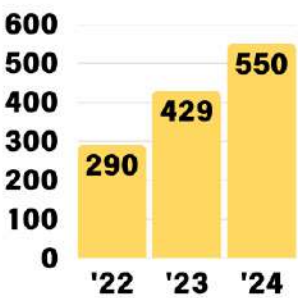
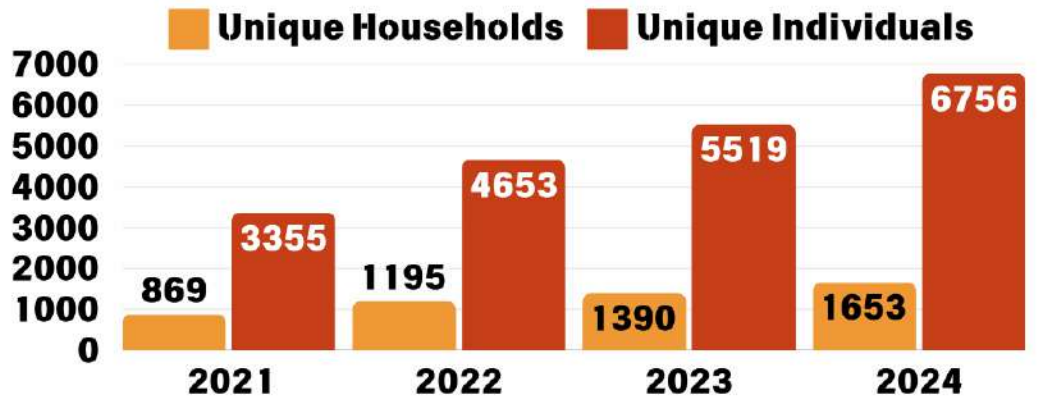

# 2024 Significant Accomplishments



## Expanded Food Bank Hours

To reduce wait times for food bank participants, our dedicated volunteers and staff have extended service hours to include a late afternoon session on Tuesdays. This additional time not only allows us to better serve our existing participants but also provides an opportunity for those who need assistance later in the day to access food support.

## 02 Thrift Store Awning Addition

The new awning provides a shaded, weather-protected area where staff and volunteers can comfortably accept and sort donations. Community member donations funded approximately half the cost for this structural improvement. This enhancement has made a significant difference, and our volunteers are deeply grateful for the addition.



## Food Storage Building

The opening of a new climate-controlled storage annex significantly expands the Food Bank's capacity by 480 sq ft and increases our ability to accept and safely store shelf-stable food. It was funded primarily by the City of Tucson's, Ward 4 under the leadership of councilwoman, Nikki Lee. ## 04 Thrift Store Update

The Vail Depot Thrift Store underwent an exciting update! Bulky, dark shelving was replaced with lighter, more efficient shelving, creating a brighter and more open shopping experience, while improving visibility for staff across the sales floor. Additionally, the Depot received a fresh coat of paint to revitalize the space. The result is a more attractive store design that facilitates efficiency and more sales.
