

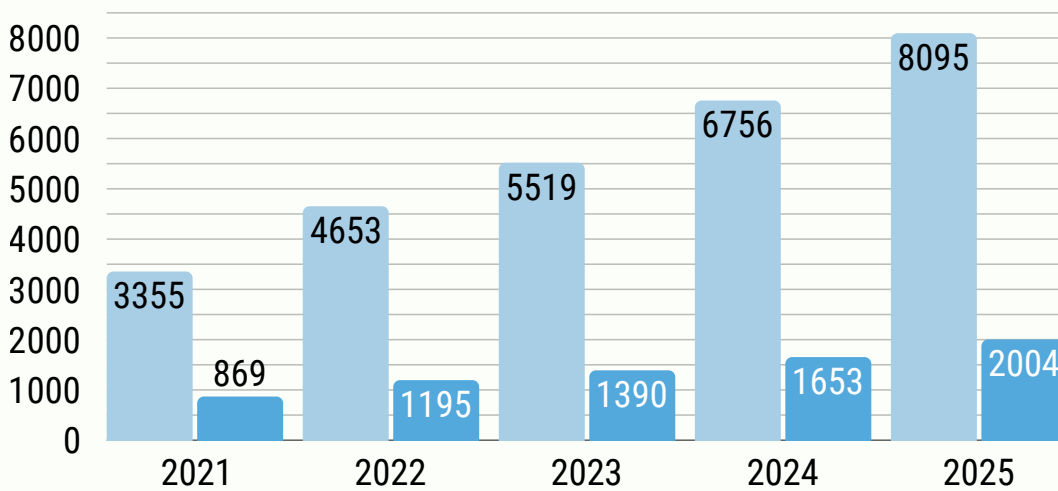

**2025 Program Highlight: Homebound Meals.** A homebound older adult in our community relies on this Program for weekly access to nutritious food and vital social connections. Unable to leave her home without assistance, she receives a weekly visit and meal box which provides both nourishment and reassurance that she is cared for and supported. The program strengthens her health, reduces isolation, and preserves her dignity by ensuring she can safely remain in her home while staying connected to her community.

### **The Vail Depot Thrift Store Generated 31% of our total revenue:**

The Vail Depot is a vital financial engine for ReSources. In 2025, the Thrift Store generated 31% of our total revenue. Net revenue helps fund Food Bank programs while helping position ReSources for future growth. Key improvements, including expanding from one to two points of sale and reorganizing intake, work, and storage areas, increased efficiency and boosted donation capacity, contributing to record revenues.



**Volunteers contributed 34,226 hours in support of our Food Bank and Thrift Store.** Volunteers are the heart of ReSources. In 2025, staff adopted more comprehensive methods for tracking volunteer engagement which reported an incredible total of 34,226 volunteer hours. This represents a 50% increase in service to our food bank and thrift store from 2024. The extraordinary growth in service hours reflects not only the dedication of our volunteers, but the strong support ReSources receives from the community.

**In 2025, ReSources partnered with United Way to bring the VITA Tax Assistance Program to Southeast Pima County.** In our first year, we projected serving 50 families, but ultimately assisted 98 households thanks to strong community outreach and dedicated volunteers. This effort resulted in \$79,225 in tax refunds, \$20,615 in Earned Income Tax Credits, and \$8,669 in Child Tax Credits, helping families file accurately and access critical federal anti-poverty programs.
